We are the **Fair Work Ombudsman**.

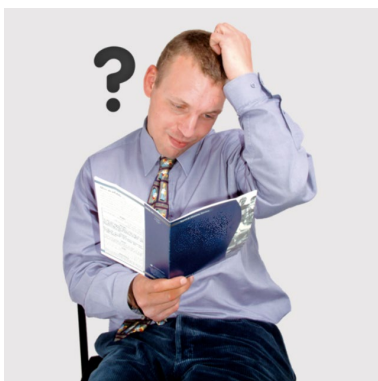
An **Ombudsman** is someone who listens to complaints and can help fix problems.



Our job is to help workers and bosses with pay and rules at work.



We, our and us means the **Fair Work Ombudsman**.

Then we write what that word means.

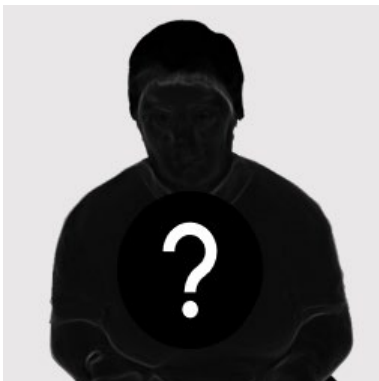
Report a problem at work



If something is not right at work, you can tell us about it.



When you tell us about the problem, you do not have to tell us your name.



This is called an **anonymous** report.

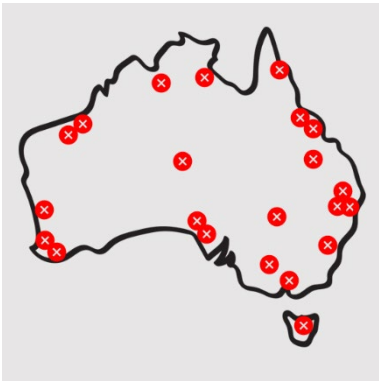
Anonymous means we do not know who you are.



We will not contact you after you make an **anonymous** report.



We will not tell your work what you tell us.



Your report will help us

- find out about workplaces doing the wrong thing
- plan our work.

What you can tell us about



You can tell us if something about your pay is wrong.



You can tell us if your work does not follow the rules.

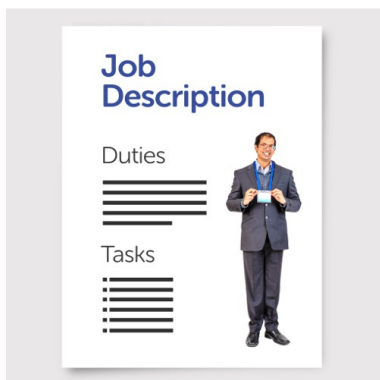
What we want to know

We want to know what the business does.

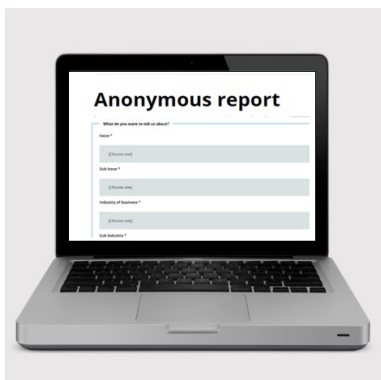


We want to know what you do at work.
